Journey to the Easter Sacraments - At the very heart of Lent is Baptism. In the ancient church, the 40 days of Lent was primarily understood by the people to be the time of immediate preparation for all the catechumens – the individuals who were going to be baptized at Easter. The community shared in that preparation and offered support to the catechumens as they anticipated renewing their own baptismal vows at easter. This Sunday as a community we will be celebrating the Rite of Sending Catechumens for Election. From St. Elizabeth Ann Seton we send Ashlynnne Finn and Rachel Myers. From St. Augustine's we send Clara Falcichio These catechumens will go to the Bishop at the Cathedral this afternoon for the Rite of Election. At this Rite the Bishop will declare them the "elect of God" and invite them into the final preparation before celebrating Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Please keep them in your prayers.
