

Journey to the Easter Sacraments – This week the parish joins with the Elect in celebrating the second Scrutiny. Why three Scrutinies? We are aware that the secret to building strength is repeated exercise. Spiritual strength is the same. Growth requires repetition. Only by doing exercises- the Scrutiny - repeatedly do the Elect – and we - get the hang of it and allow grace to strengthen us. This week we hear the story of the Man Born Blind. His persistence in faith reminds us of what it means to continue in faith. We are challenged to question what blindness keeps us from drawing closer to God? Conscious of the ways we have been blind to God's presence, let us join with the Elect and seek God's forgiveness and healing, asking to have our sight restored. Please continue to pray for the Elect and Candidates as they approach the Easter Sacraments.

Invitation to Adoration- As we strive to deepen our prayer life this Lent, consider adoration. "If by 'prayer' we mean communicating with God, then whenever we participate in adoration, we are engaging in the highest form of communication with God, even if no words are exchanged. This, then, is the essence of contemplative prayer"- Bishop Checchio. St. Mary's offers adoration on Tuesday from 9 am to 6:30 pm and, during Lent, overnight adoration from 8 pm Friday to 8 am Saturday. St. EAS offers adoration on Wednesday from 5:30 to 6:30 pm and Fridays from 7:30 to 9 am.
