SEAS parish has consistently been generous to the Heifer International "Fill the Ark" project. During Lent, we have the opportunity to focus on Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. These spiritual practices, linked to the great work that is done by Heifer, allow us to celebrate communion with others and prepare for Easter.

Journey to the Easter Sacraments –. This week we celebrate the third and final Scrutiny for those who will be initiated into our faith this Easter. We hear the reading that tells of the miracle of Jesus raising his friend Lazarus from the dead. For those who are about to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation and for us as a community we are invited to consider how Jesus' command to be unbound and go free can be true for us as well. Through Jesus we can be freed from all that binds us up and holds us in tombs of sin, despair and death. Consider what you wish to be made free from. What holds you captive? What keeps you bound up? Jesus is the resurrection and the life for each of us. Turn to Jesus and ask to be made free.

Invitation to Adoration- St. Teresa of Calcutta asks, "Have you seen with the eyes of your soul how He looks at you with love? Do you really know the love of Jesus? Have you heard the words He speaks to you?" Come see, know, and hear the love of Jesus during Eucharistic Adoration, offered at St. Mary's on Tuesdays from 9 am to 6:30 pm and, during Lent, on Fridays at 8 pm to 8 am Saturday. St. EAS offers adoration on Wednesdays from 5:30 to 6:30 pm and Fridays from 7:30 to 9 am.
