Journey to the Easter Sacraments – Holy Week Having completed the Scrutinies, the Elect and Candidates move with the entire community into the celebration of Holy Week. This is such an important week in the liturgical year and there is so much depth in the celebrations we are about to participate in. Holy Week ends with the Triduum – the three-day liturgical celebration that commemorates the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus. All though it takes place over three days, the liturgy is considered to be one single event that unveils the saving mystery of Christ. Please keep the Elect and Candidates in your prayer this week, that the Lord God may complete in them the good work that He has already begun!

Invitation to Adoration- this Palm Sunday, we remember those who laid down the palms to welcome Jesus into Jerusalem. They cried out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"- John 12:13. Come welcome Jesus and his peace during Eucharistic Adoration, offered at St. Mary's on Tuesday from 9 am to 6:30 pm and overnight during Lent from 8 pm Friday to 8 am Saturday. St. EAS offers adoration on Wednesday from 5:30 to 6:30 and Friday from 7:30 to 9 am.

A Pancake Breakfast and Easter Egg Hunt will take place this weekend, March 29th from 8:30am-12 Noon at St. Augustine's Church. All proceeds help the High School Youth Ministry's trip to the Steubenville Conference this summer.

Holy Week Ministry Sign Ups - As we near Holy Week, we are looking for liturgical ministers to assist during the Sacred Triduum. In the Gathering Space, you will find sign-up sheets for Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday. Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and Altar Servers are asked to help us make these very special liturgies a reverent experience of Jesus' Death and Resurrection.

The Light is On for You As our preparation for Easter is in its final days, we have one last push for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please join us Monday, March 30th, from 1PM-3PM at St. Augustine's or 4PM-7PM at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. If it has been a while, then it is time. There will be handy guides to help you in preparation and in celebrating the sacrament. Come and encounter the loving mercy of the Lord this Holy Week!

Easter Flowers – The youth ministry program will be selling tulips and daffodils after all masses this weekend. The flowers can be taken home or left at Church in memory of loved ones for Easter. You may list name/s in the Memorial Book. In addition to purchasing flowers from the youth group, you can drop off your own flowers during Holy Week in the former daily Mass area. On Holy Saturday, you can place them in the Worship Area.

Easter Food Blessing on Holy Saturday (April 4th) at 12:00noon. This tradition dates back to the 12th Century in Eastern Europe. It is common to bring a basket of both symbolic foods, such as hard boiled eggs, butter (often shaped as a lamb), bread, as well as other traditional foods. Join us again or the first time for this special food blessing.

Celebrate Easter and our OCIA Candidates We will joyfully welcome the OCIA candidates who are receiving Sacraments next Saturday at 8:00PM. Please plan to join a special celebration hosted by the Seton Servers with cake, cookies, and punch after the Easter Vigil on Saturday.

Counseling Services – St. Augustine, St Mary's and St Elizabeth parishes have partnered with Catholic Charities to provide counseling service. Each week, a caring capable therapist comes to Augustine's to meet with individuals, couples, and families who request this service.
