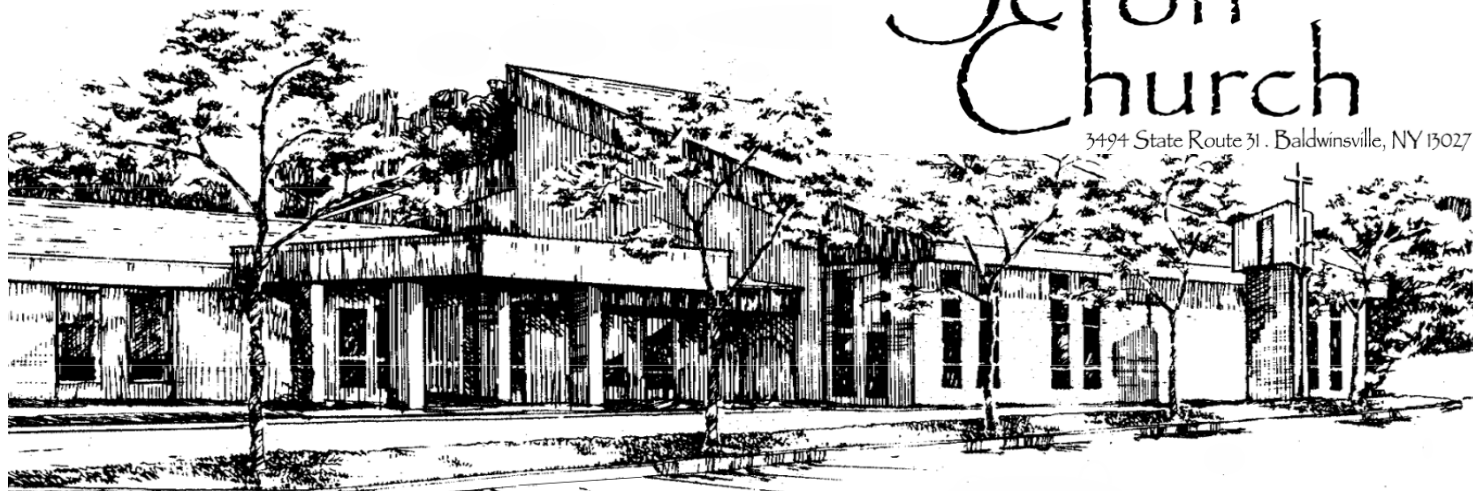

Celebrate Divine Mercy with your Family The Church celebrates the gift of God's Divine Mercy on the First Sunday after Easter. If you are not familiar with this devotion, do yourself and your family a favor and google "Divine Mercy Novena." This will bring you the opportunity to learn more about this devotion. Saint Faustina is the one who brought it to the world just last century – in Church terms, that's fairly new. It was such a great gift to spend a "Year of Mercy" a couple years back, stir up that gift again in your life and in your family. There is a special Novena which begins on Good Friday and concludes on Divine Mercy Sunday.

Invitation to Adoration- As we meditate on the Eucharist this Easter Season, we experience Christ's love for us. The USCCB tells us, "In the Eucharistic liturgy and our prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, we encounter God's presence in personal and profound ways." St. Mary's offers adoration on Tuesdays from 9 am to 6:30 pm. St. EAS offers adoration on Wednesdays from 5 to 7 pm and Fridays from 7:30 to 9 am. "Jesus awaits us in this sacrament of love"- St. Pope John Paul II.

Change in Adoration Time at SEAS – Please note that as of April 15th, the Wednesday Holy Hour will be from 5:00PM – 7:00PM. There will be NO Confession.

Our Daily bREAD- As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, we are reminded of the great love and mercy Jesus pours out upon us through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. It is a beautiful invitation to trust more deeply in His mercy and to extend that same mercy to others in our daily lives. Rooted in Scripture and the message of Divine Mercy given to St. Faustina Kowalska, we are called to grow in trust, hope, and mercy. For our younger readers, *Divine Mercy for Children* offers a simple and meaningful way to understand this beautiful devotion. Come explore our many books and resources on Divine Mercy. We encourage attendance at this Mass to pray for those who have been harmed, those who have been affected physically, emotionally, and spiritually by abuse, and all those who have a role in the healing process.
