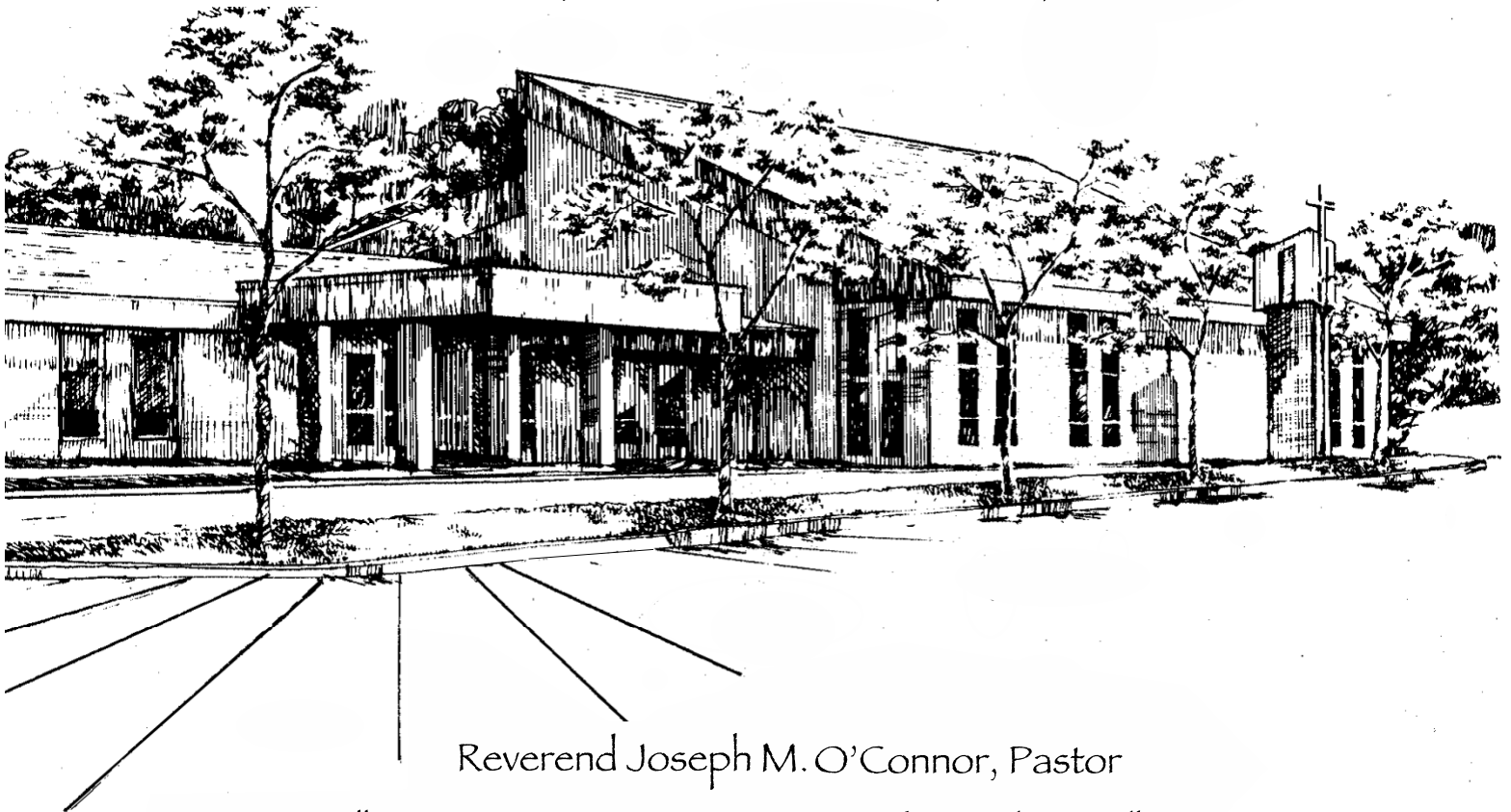

If anyone is in need of food, we are here for you. The pantry is open Tuesdays & Wednesdays from 9am – 11am. Families are eligible to come once a month.

Anna is looking for info on Easter Duty and Holy Days of Obligation. *The Liturgy Office answered:*

Reminder: Easter Duties Among the precepts of the Church are the duties to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, during the Easter season (can. 920) and to confess grave sins at least once a year (can. 989). These precepts often go together because in order to receive Holy Communion, one must be in a "state of grace," that is free from grave sin (can. 916). Thus, they are called the "Easter duties." In the United States, they may be fulfilled between the First Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday (7 June 2020). When it is impossible for those who have not already done so to fulfill these duties, they are *suspended*. Therefore, there is no obligation to fulfill them during the Easter season, unless and until public gatherings for Mass and prayer resume.

Ascension Thursday The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is always celebrated on Ascension *Thursday* in the Diocese of Syracuse. This year it is Thursday, May 21st. In some dioceses, it is observed on the Seventh Sunday of Easter. However, the ecclesiastical Provinces of Boston, Hartford, New York, Newark, Omaha, and Philadelphia have retained its celebration on Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter (forty days after Easter). The dispensation of the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has now been extended to include Holy Days of Obligation since normal public gatherings are still suspended. Therefore, the faithful are not obliged to attend Mass for the Ascension. However, they should still observe this Solemnity by participating in streamed Masses and by devoting themselves to prayer, meditation on the Scriptures, and charitable works.

First Communions are rescheduled for June 13/14 In response to the limit on gatherings, First Communions will be moved to the Feast of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ – what a great weekend to receive Jesus for the first time! Updates will be sent to families from Julie Moss, director of Elementary Faith Formation.

He drives away all sorrow to fill me with His consolations. He is my guide, my friend and supporter—with such a guide, can I fear? With such a friend, shall I not be satisfied? With such a supporter, can I fall? Oh! Then, my adored refuge, let not my frail nature shrink at your command...Rather, let me say, ‘Lord, here am I, the creature of your will,’ rejoicing that You will lead, thankful that You will choose for me. Only continue to grant me Your soul-cheering presence. And in life, or in death, let me be Your own.”—St. Elizabeth Ann Seton
