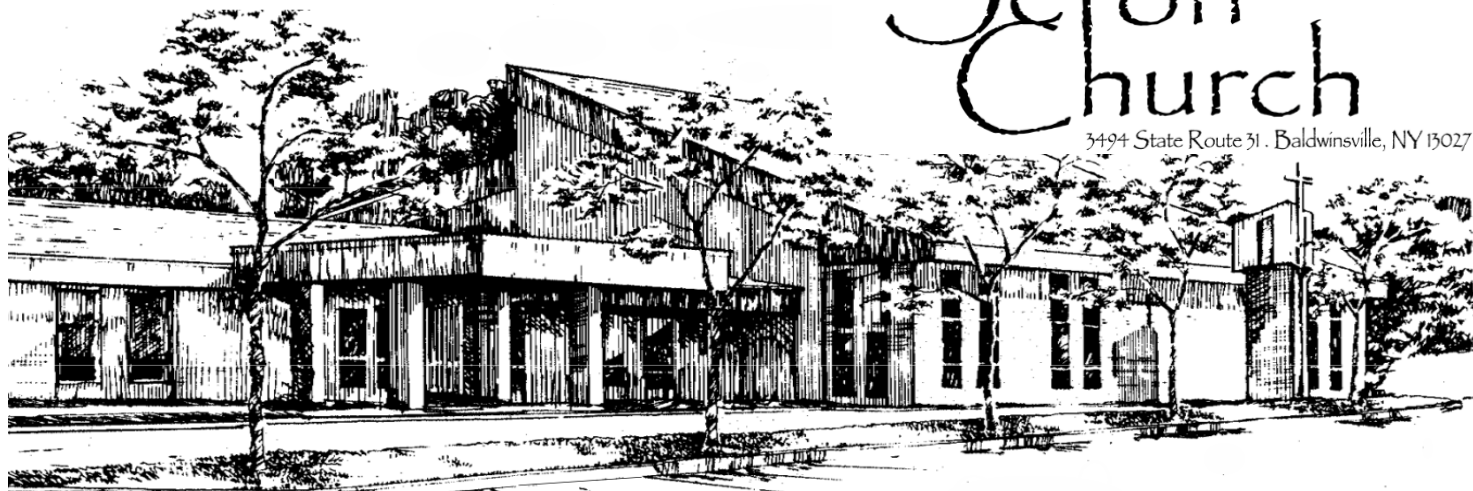

Counseling Services – St. Augustine, St Mary's and St Elizabeth parishes have partnered with Catholic Charities to provide counseling service.
