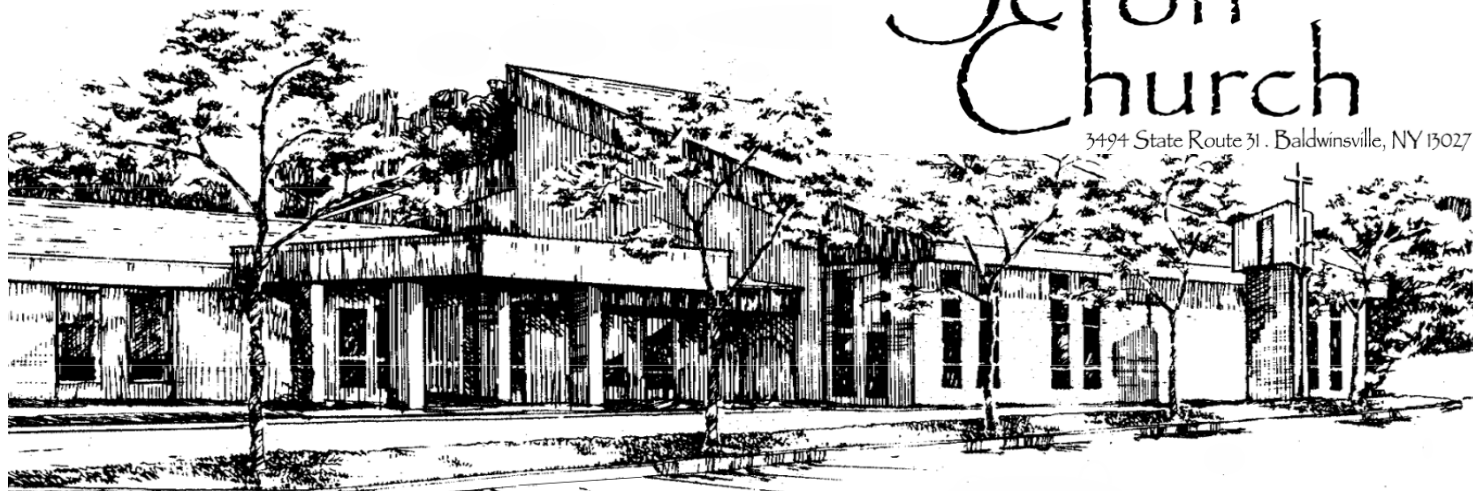

Attention All Eucharistic Ministers - Effective March 1, 2025 the diocese requires all liturgical ministers complete Safe Environment training and undergo a criminal background check. The train by date for **Eucharistic Ministers** is **December 31, 2025**. For those that need re-certification please check the diocese website for available dates. *Pre-registration is required for these sessions*. Beginning September 1, 2025, all **Sacristans, Adult Altar Servers** and **Lectors** must complete Safe Environment training by June 30, 2026. Members of the **Music Ministry**, which includes **choir members** and **instrumentalists** must complete Safe Environment training by March 31, 2026.

The Rites for Entrance into the Community- The journey of faith is a transformative experience for both the people seeking to become Catholic Christians and the whole Catholic community. The rituals in this process are powerful encounters with the living God, that shapes the hearts and minds of those preparing for a new life in Christ, as well as those who celebrate these rituals with them. The first public steps for seekers who are seeking Baptism is the Rite of Entrance into the Catechumenate. After celebrating this rite, they are now officially part of Christ and part of the Church and are known as "Catechumens." Individuals who are already baptized celebrate a Rite of Welcome and are known as Candidates. Their baptism has already brought them into union with Christ and his Church. We currently have from SEAS 2 Adult Catechumens (to be baptized) and 2 youth Catechumens. We have 4 Adult Candidates, and 1 youth candidate. This Rite greets them and invites them to complete their Catholic initiation through Confirmation and Eucharist. It is the whole Catholic church that has the responsibility to initiate new members into the Catholic community. Please take the time to greet and welcome the individuals celebrating these rites. Please pray for our Catechumens and Candidates.

Counseling Services – St. Augustine, St Mary's and St Elizabeth parishes have partnered with Catholic Charities to provide counseling service. Each week, a caring capable therapist comes to Augustine's to meet with individuals, couples, and families who request this service. Services are provided for a fee based on the individual's or family's ability to pay. The sliding fee ranges from \$0 to \$85 per session. The parish's financial contribution for the program assists in this low or no fee option. No one is turned away. Requests for services can be made directly to Catholic Charities by calling Ellen Ketchum at 315-362-7568. People choose counseling for many different reasons, but all come with the same hope...that tomorrow will be better

All Saint's Day Mass- All Saints is a churchwide holy day of obligation and normally celebrated on Nov. 1. If the first day of November falls on a Saturday or Monday, at least in the United States, the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated. Therefore, it is not a Holy Day this year, but a mass will be celebrated at St. Mary's on Saturday, Nov 1st @ 9:00am.

Saturday, Nov 1st 5:30pm Mass – This Mass will be our All Soul's Day in which we will be remembering our recently deceased in a special way. With the extra recognition, this Mass will be a bit fuller in number and longer in time, so please take note since you might want to attend a different Mass time.
