Anna Asks... How can we support missionaries? Last week, we looked at the work of missionaries. It is important to recall that the life of a missionary begins in radical friendship with Jesus - when they heard Jesus invite them to follow him in a close way and then to go out to others and walk with them as friends. Missionaries will travel to places most of us will never visit, so we can offer them support in three ways. First, pray. Pray for them to remain always close to Jesus and faithful to what He asks them to do. Pray for safety in their travels and the success of their efforts. Second, support them financially. Today we are taking a special collection for Missionhurst missionaries. Keep your eyes and ears open for other missionary groups throughout the year that you can support. Third, consider joining them. Alright, this is not for everyone, but there may be a mission trip in your future or even a calling to a radical friendship with Jesus where you leave everything in order to serve others.
