**Anna Asks+ What should we call the seminarian Brendan Foley?** We use titles for the ordained clergy: Deacon, Father, Bishop, Pope. Someday, God@+illing, we will call Brendan by those titles (well, some of them anyways). At this point, Brendan is not yet ordained. While he is still a seminarian, we call him by his first name. **Then, why does he dress like a priest?** Great follow@up question! The Diocesan guidelines for the seminarians on pastoral year are meant to help the students prepare for the very public role they will be taking on. The clerical collar makes Brendan identifiable as a seminarian and future@priest. During liturgies, he will wear a cassock and surplice a white garment worn over a black robe). Again, these are liturgical vestment for clerics and makes Brendan identifiable as a seminarian.

**RCIA – The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: What Is It and Who Is It For?** St Elizabeth Ann Seton parish extends an invitation to those people who have been Baptized in another Christian faith, never Baptized in any faith or to Baptized Catholics who have never received the Sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation. Catholics who would like to know more about their faith are also welcome and invited to attend. This rite dates back to the time of the apostles and the early fathers of the church and was restored after the Second Vatican Council. It is the perfect place for you to learn more about responding to God's call and finding answers to all your questions about the Catholic faith. If you feel RCIA may be intended for you (or you know of a friend or relative you could pass this along to) please consider joining our RCIA process. Emphasis is always placed on sharing with others in a comfortable and friendly group setting. Those who complete the program will join themselves to Christ in the Catholic Church and celebrate through reception of the sacraments of Baptism (if not previously Baptized), Holy Eucharist and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil.
