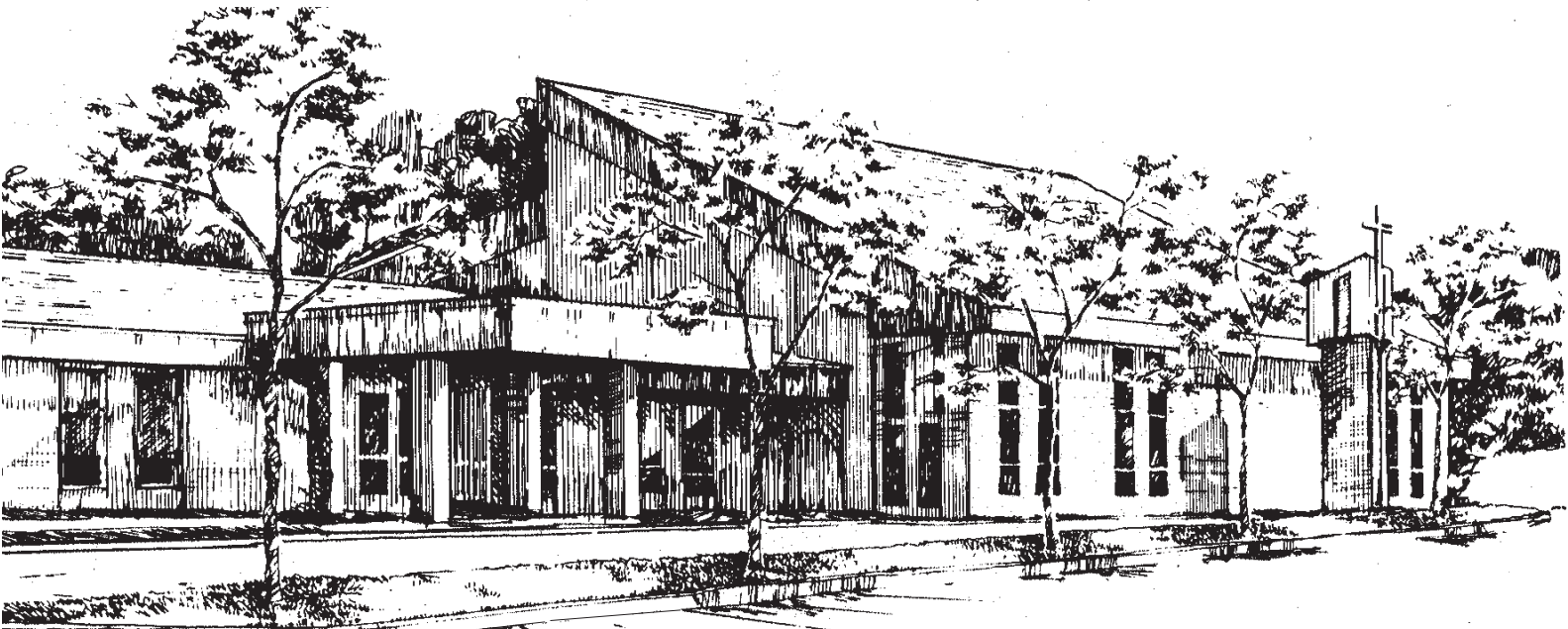

A number of parishioners asked for more opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration, so we will begin to do that more often. Keep an eye out for these special opportunities to spend time with Jesus.

**Anna Asks...** **What was the gold thing that the host was in during the day of prayer last week?** When the Church celebrates Eucharistic Adoration, the consecrated host, now the Body of Christ, is placed in a decorative gold monstrance as a sign of reverence for the real presence of Jesus. It is a sign of our respect for the King of Kings, who draws close to us. Additionally, it draws our attention to the Blessed Sacrament. The word “monstrance” shares the same root word as “demonstration.” It demonstrates God’s love for us...humble, waiting, silent, available. We have the chance to meet that love and receive all the graces he longs to share with us. Look for upcoming opportunities to spend that time with the Lord.
