Anna Asks... In the "Glory Be" prayer, we say "as it was in the beginning." Since God always was, whose beginning is it?

You are right that God is without beginning or end. Remember that the Bible begins with these same words, "*In the beginning*, when God created the heavens and the earth..." It seems that the Glory Be prayer captures that same moment – the beginning of creation, the beginning of our relationship with God. The line Anna mentions in her question is part of a larger statement: "as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be." This prayer invites us to lift our minds and hearts to give glory to God – again a way of being in relationship with God, a relationship that is eternal. We are part of a communion that existed before our limited time on earth and continues after, as we just celebrated with the Feast Days of All Saints and All Souls. As you say this prayer during the Rosary and at other times, a God who exists forever invites you into a relationship that lasts forever.
