The Year of the Family is Wrapping Up As we move towards the end of the liturgical year on November 25th, the Feast Day of Christ the King, Bishop Cunningham has invited parishes to celebrate the conclusion of this special year. Anna Asks... *What is a novena?* A novena is a nine-day period of private or public prayer to obtain special graces, to implore special favors, or make special petitions. (Novena is derived from the Latin *novem*, meaning nine.) As the definition suggests, the novena has always had more of a sense of urgency and neediness. The Acts of the Apostles recounts that after the Ascension, the Apostles "devoted themselves to constant prayer" (Acts 1:12,14). Nine days later, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles at Pentecost. Perhaps, this "nine-day period of prayer" of the apostles is the basis for the novena.
