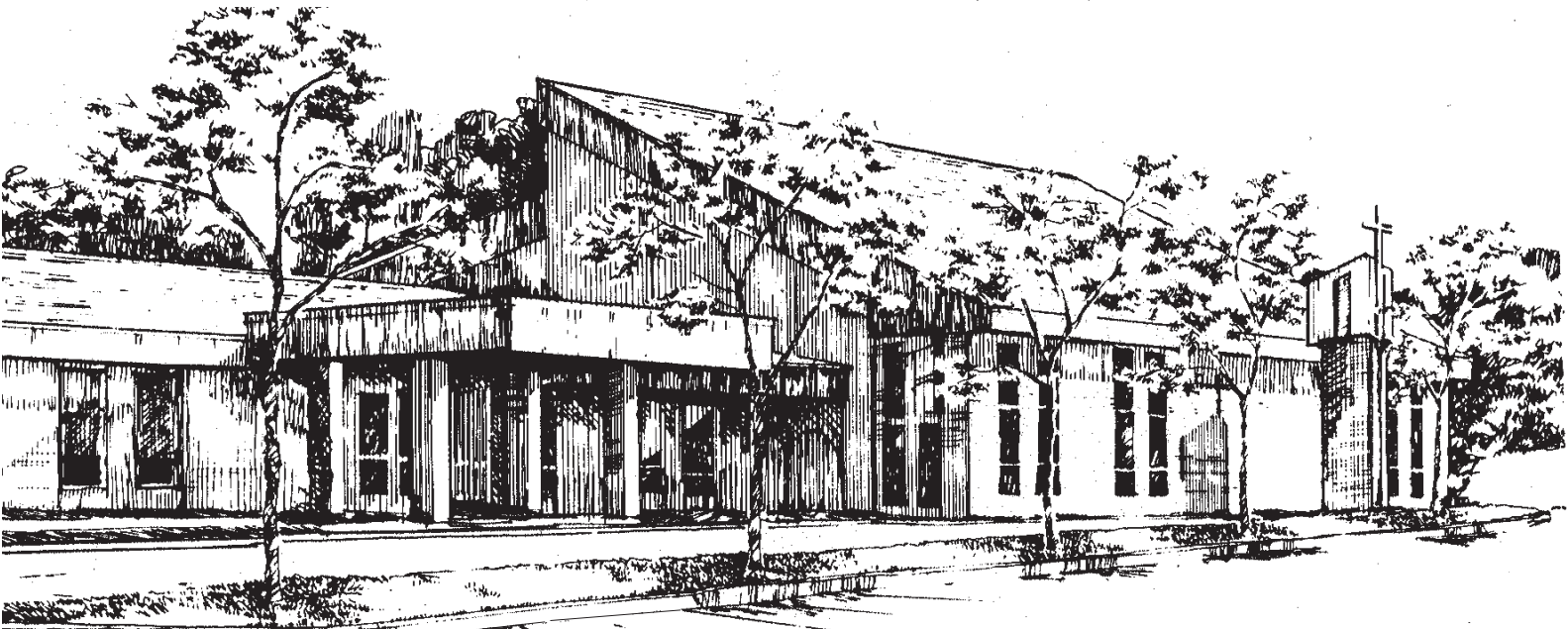

**First Reconciliation** Just a reminder that First Reconciliation will be held on **Sunday, January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 1:00pm** for students who are preparing for their First Holy Communion this year. Please pray for our children as they prepare to celebrate this special sacrament of forgiveness and new life in Christ.

**First Holy Communion** A meeting to pray, prepare, and discuss First Communion will take place on **Monday, February 4<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm** in the worship area, starting with a teaching Mass by Fr. O'Connor. First Communion dates are Saturday, May 4<sup>th</sup> at the 5:00 pm Mass, Sunday, May 5<sup>th</sup> at the 9:00 am and 11:00 am Masses. The forms for requesting Mass times will be distributed at this meeting.

**Anna Asks** *Why are there so many candles in Church?* So far, we have talked about candles in general, Altar Candles and Advent candles specifically. Today we want to explain the use of a **Sanctuary Lamp**. The sanctuary lamp is placed in the vicinity of the tabernacle, to remind the faithful of Christ's real Eucharistic presence. It often has a red cover to distinguish it from other candles in the church. In the Old Testament, the book of Exodus describes how God commanded the Israelites to crush pure oil from olives. They were to burn it perpetually in a lamp before the Tabernacle of the Testimony, which is the tent where the Ark of the Covenant and the sacred vessels for worship were kept (Ex 27:20). If this lamp signaled to the people a sacred presence, then how much more should we be aware of the holiest space in a Catholic Church, where God is truly present in the Eucharist? Take a minute and locate the sanctuary lamp at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church...remember it is placed near the tabernacle. By design, Fr. Finnegan placed the tabernacle in a separate chapel. One of the first things you see as you enter the building is the tabernacle – straight through the Gathering Space. On the wall, above the entrance, hangs a sanctuary lamp. It does not have a red cover, but it is a reminder for us that Jesus is present, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, in the Blessed Sacrament, kept in the tabernacle in the Eucharistic Chapel. Be sure to make a sign of reverence as you pass by.

**Mass Intention Schedule Changes** If you requested a Mass intention for 2019, please call the office (315-652-4300) to confirm the day and time. Due to the change in Mass times for 2019, there may need to be a change in either the day or time that was requested. Since these intentions are often requested for special days (birthdays, anniversaries, etc), every effort will be made to keep the intention on the day for which it was originally scheduled. However, that may mean a new Mass time. If the Mass time is more important, the requested Mass intention can be moved to another date. You can do this by calling the parish office. Thank you for your understanding.

**The Fishermans Club** is an initiative sponsored by the Diocese of Syracuse that reaches out to young adult men who are thinking about the priesthood. The Fishermans Club aims to build fraternity among young adult Catholic men as well as provide these men with the tools for mature discernment of their vocation. The meetings begin with prayer at 7:00PM in Panasci Chapel

at LeMoyne College. Prayer will include Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Vespers, a talk on discernment time for silent reflection and personal prayer as well as Solemn Benediction. After prayer, the group will move to the Drescher Room in Panasci Chapel for a time of fellowship and witness when pizza and soft drinks will be provided. The meetings always conclude by 8:30PM.
