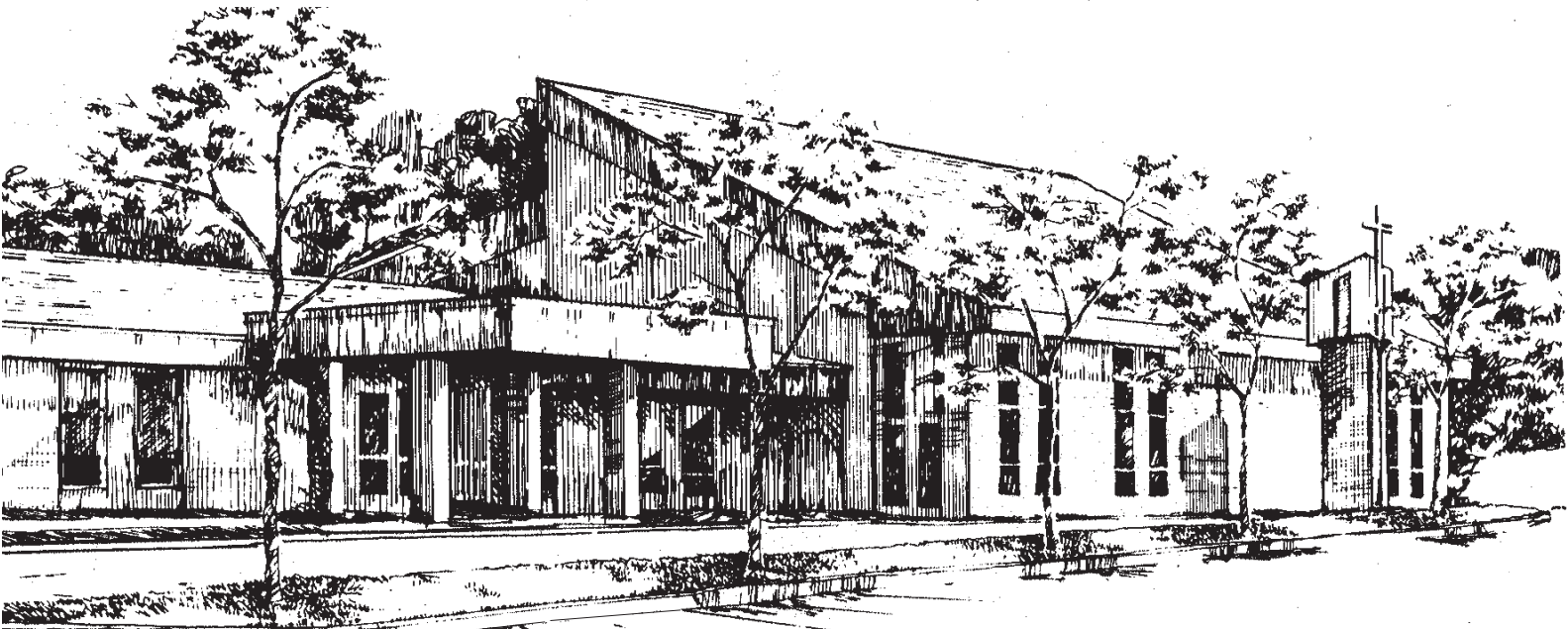

Anna Asks **What happened to the animals in the Garden of Eden?** Were they kicked out because of humanity's sin? The creation accounts in the book of Genesis inform us that God created humans as the pinnacle of creation. When he created animals, the bible doesn't say that they all lived in Eden, just that God brought them to Adam to see what he would name them. "The man gave names to all the tame animals, all the birds of the air, and all the wild animals" (Genesis 2:19-20). Interesting to note, before Adam and Eve were expelled from the Garden, God clothed them in animal skins. This hint at animal sacrifice because of sin points to the "Lamb of God" (John 1:29) who will come to be sacrificed for all of our sins when Jesus gives up his life on the cross. The Apostle Paul said all of creation was subjected to the corrupting effects of the Fall and that the day is coming when it too shall be freed from this corruption (Romans 8:18-22).

"The greater my unworthiness, the more abundant His mercy."-St. EAS. We are all challenged in our readings today to have humility before God. Paul recognizes that given his earlier life as a harsh persecutor of Christians, it goes against all logic that God would reveal himself and choose him to be an apostle. Simon Peter, also aware of his own sinfulness, is called by Jesus to be a part of his mission spreading the Gospel. Given their 'unworthiness,' both of these unlikely figures became incredible models of faith. What might God do with our lives if we just abandon ourselves entirely to his abundant mercy, and allow ourselves to be molded by his grace?
