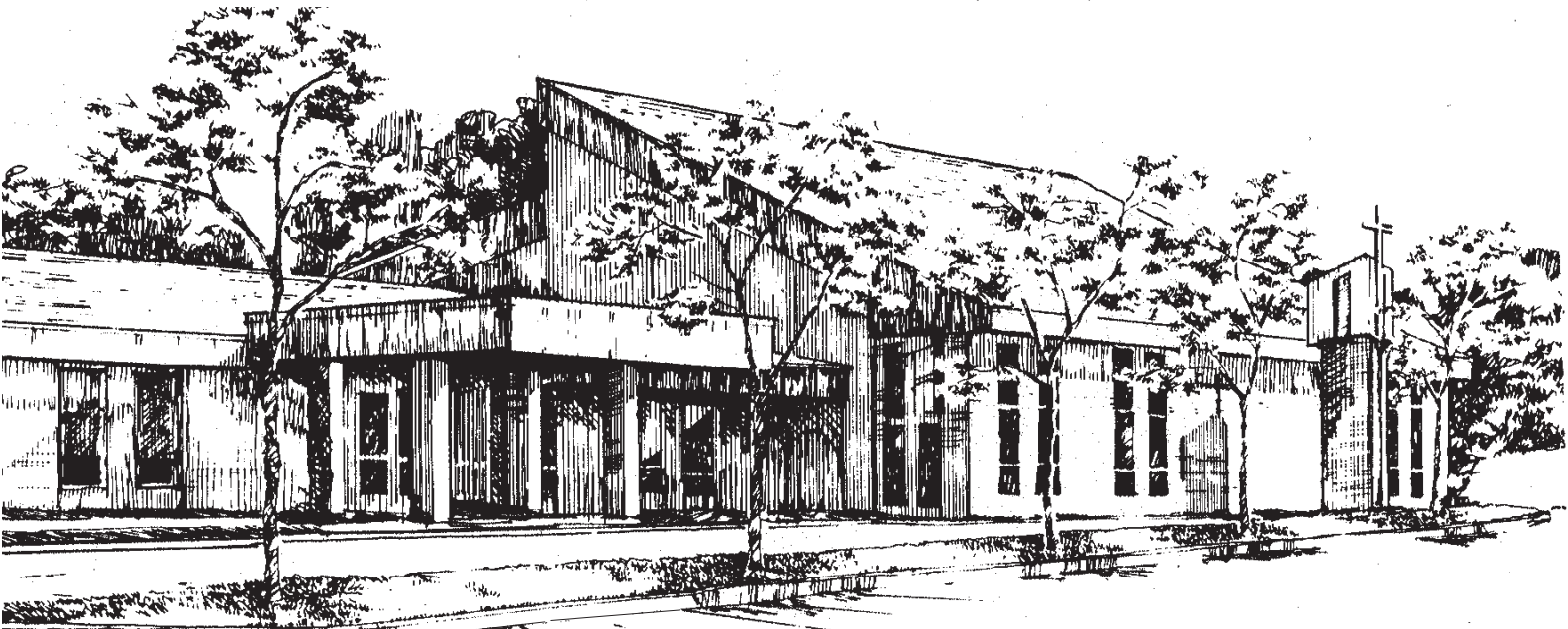

Anna Asks... **Why does Ash Wednesday change dates each year?** The beginning of Lent depends on the date of Easter. Easter follows a lunar, rather than a solar, calendar and is celebrated on the Sunday that follows the first full moon after March 21, the vernal (spring) equinox. Therefore Easter cannot fall earlier than March 22 or later than April 25. Most of the Eastern Churches follow the same basic principles but often celebrate Easter on a date different from Catholics and other Western Christians because they continue to follow the calendar of Julius Caesar without the corrections incorporated by Pope Gregory XIII in 1582. So, Lent is counted 40 days before Easter, without counting Sundays, and that gives us the date of Ash Wednesday.

The Word of God & Mother Seton...

It's easy for us to recall the Beatitudes, but what probably doesn't come so quickly to mind is the striking end of today's Gospel: "But woe to you who are rich...who are filled now...who laugh...woe to you when all speak well of you..." It is difficult not to find ourselves in one of those categories that Jesus cautions. Mother Seton's own attempt to live the beatitudes should inspire our own—always go out having first been strengthened by the Eucharist: "Jesus is there, we can go receive Him. He is our own...It is certainly true as that bread naturally taken removes my hunger. This Bread of Angels removes my pain, my cares; warms, cheers soothes, contents and renews my whole being."

Vocation Reflection... The Beatitudes are a life-changing teaching. They need to be proclaimed today, just as much as they did the day Jesus taught them for the first time. If you feel called to teach as Jesus did, contact the Vocations Office at 315-470-1468.
