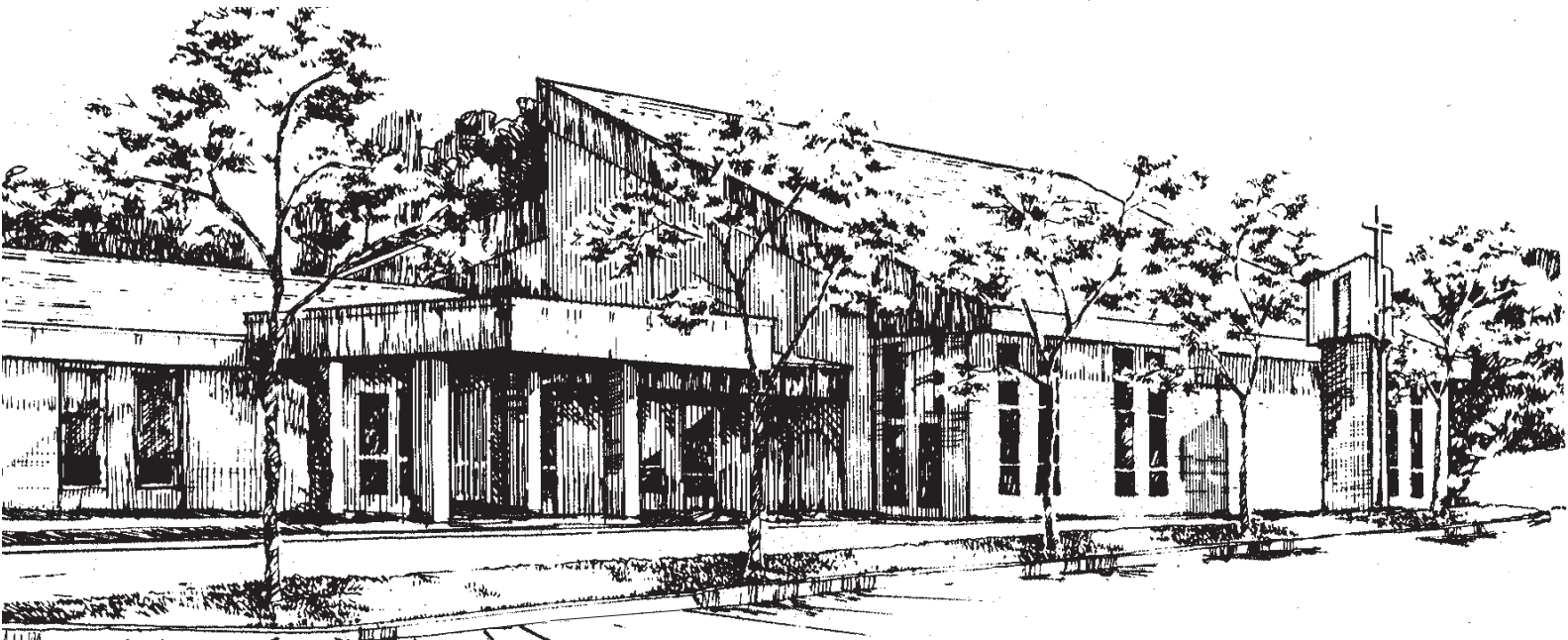

**Anna Asks... What kind of bread is used for communion?** Anna asks a great question. Some kids say it tastes like cardboard... how do they know what cardboard tastes like? Back to Anna's question - We know that at the last supper, Jesus used unleavened bread (bread without yeast), because it was the Passover meal, a reminder of the time the Jewish people were fleeing slavery in Egypt. Keeping the same formula is important. The official description for this bread is: The bread used in the celebration of the Most Holy Eucharistic Sacrifice must be unleavened, purely of wheat, and recently made." The bread-making is loaded with symbolism and meaning as it is broken and shared. The words Jesus spoke are repeated as He instructed His Apostles. This allows us to experience the Eucharistic bread as something different. This is no ordinary meal. This is the Body of Christ by which we are set free. Wow! What an amazing experience our first communion students will have this weekend. Let us pray that everyone at Mass can approach Holy Communion as if it were the first time, the only time, the last time that we will receive the Body and Blood of Jesus.

This is a special opportunity amidst the busy and hectic pace of life, where work, kids, household chores can be the focus of conversation.
