Anna Asks... *Why does a priest lay on the floor during Ordination?* Before the actual Ordination takes place, the Bishop invites the congregation to intercede on the behalf of the candidate as he approaches the sacrament of Holy Orders through a special prayer, called the Litany of Saints. This calls to mind the fact that not only those faithful on earth, but also the entire Church in heaven is praying during this important moment. We invoke Mary and Joseph, the saints from the Gospels and the heroic martyrs of the early Church, some of the humblest saints and some of the most influential teachers of the Church, as well as the founders of the great religious orders, and ask them for their prayers. The one being ordained will lay on the floor while the assembly prays. The gesture of prostration is a symbol of his submission to the will of God. It is a reminder of his unworthiness and total dependence on God. This is a very powerful moment as this man hands his life over to God in total abandon. After the Litany, the Bishop prays the prayer of consecration and lays hands on his head – the moment he becomes a priest.
