**Anna Asks... What is a pilgrimage?** Pilgrimage has been a Christian tradition since the first recorded spiritual journey, in which a bishop named Mileto from Sardis in Asia Minor traveled to the Holy Land in around 160AD to visit "the place where [things described in the Bible] were preached and done." What a pilgrimage is all about is never as important as why you are on one - 'how' to encounter God. During the pilgrimage, pilgrims search their hearts to make sure they are still adhering to the reason for making their pilgrimage so that it will not just become an excursion, which would be the case if pilgrims end up shopping and site-seeing and are not interested in the spiritual aspects, so pray for the grace of the moment to unite ourselves with the spirit of God. You may want to take a pilgrimage as a family to nearby shrines in Buffalo, Montreal, Auriesville, Stockbridge. Even if these are not your final destinations, look for a spot to stop on your way to a family vacation and make a summer pilgrimage.

**Hospitality** During the summer months, coffee will not be served after Masses. While this is a break from preparing the kitchen before Mass, it is not a break from hospitality. Visitors to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish are warmly greeted and offered a bulletin at each Mass. Please consider coming early and assisting in this way at summer Masses. You can also bring up the gifts. This would be a great ministry to do as a family during the summer months.
