

Anna Asks...Did the Pope really pick the new bishop? The answer is Yes. Here's how it happens...The Papal Nuncio in the United States gathered recommendations from bishops and cardinals and then sent a list of three names, terna, to Rome. A cardinal relator is chosen to summarize the documentation and make a report to the full congregation. The Congregation may follow the recommendation of the nuncio, chose another of the candidates on the terna, or even ask that another terna be prepared. At a private audience with the pope, usually on a Saturday, the prefect of the Congregation for Bishops presents the recommendations of the Congregation to the Holy Father. A few days later, the pope informs the Congregation of his decision. The Congregation then notifies the nuncio, who in turn contacts the candidate and asks if he will accept. If the answer is "yes," the Vatican is notified and a date is set for the announcement.

Ordination of Bishop Lucia Plans are well underway for Evening Prayer (7pm, August 7) and the Ordination/Installation Mass (2pm, August 8) at The Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. You must have a ticket to attend the Ordination Mass on August 8th. However, Evening Prayer on August 7 at 7pm is an open event. No tickets are required and Bishop-elect Lucia will be preaching. For those unable to attend either event, the Ordination/Installation Mass will be live streamed on our diocesan Youtube channel. We also anticipate it being available through other media outlets. More to come as we get closer to the date.
