

Anna Asks... **What are the items a new bishop gets when he is ordained?** During the Ordination Mass, there are a number of items presented to Bishop Lucia as signs of his office. **Presentation of the Book of Gospels** As Bishop Lucia is presented with the Book of Gospels he is commissioned to evangelize with all patience and sound teaching. **Handing on of the Insignia: Ring, Miter and Crosier** Bishop Lucia is presented with the signs of his office: The ring is the symbol of the bishop's fidelity to his nuptial bond with the Church. The miter is a sign of his role as herald of truth. The crosier (pastoral staff) is a sign of his shepherding and governing office. **Seating of the Bishop** Cardinal Dolan invites Bishop Lucia to occupy the cathedra, the bishop's chair.

In addition to these items, there are symbolic acts during the ordination. **Laying on of Hands** In silence, Cardinal Dolan imposes hands on the head of Bishop-elect Lucia, invoking the power of the Holy Spirit, the same given by Christ to the apostles. The co-consecrators, Bishop Cunningham and Bishop LaValley, and all the other bishops also impose hands signifying that the ordination of a bishop is a collegial act of the Order of Bishops, incorporating a new member into their community for the service of the Church.

Book of Gospels is held over the head of Bishop-elect Lucia as a sign of the power of God's word. This ancient rite, dating back to the fifth or sixth century, signifies the "yoke of the Gospel," reminding the new bishop that preaching the word of God is the "pre-eminent obligation" of the office of bishop. The **Prayer of Ordination** is prayed by Cardinal Dolan while two deacons hold the open Book of Gospels above the head of Bishop-elect Lucia, Cardinal Dolan and the bishops join in the Prayer of Ordination. This ancient prayer, used as early as the beginning of the third century for the ordination of a bishop, invokes the power of the Holy Spirit upon the Bishop-elect and recalls the important role of the bishop within the Church.

The Word of God & Mother Seton...“The gate of heaven is very low...only the humble may enter it.”—*Mother Seton*. Ecclesiastes: “*Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!*” “*All his days sorrow and grief are his occupation; even at night his mind is not at rest.*” What sounds like a very pessimistic author, will later reveal one who finds a much deeper sense of joy in laboring for the Lord. Fleeting, insubstantial, and without lasting value are the “vanities” Qoheleth writes of. Yet, after hearing this we receive Paul’s challenge to the Colossians: “*seek what is above.*” The things above, the things of God, are always good, beautiful, and true—unlike the vanities of this world. God is eternal, omnipotent, and all-knowing, yet he proves his wisdom is unlike human wisdom. His wisdom is the Cross; His wisdom is humility. Let us not focus on the fading things of this world, but rather on God’s ever-abiding presence that alone sustains us. Focusing on this truth will relieve our restlessness and anxiety
