Anna Asks... Why bless items like rosary beads? There are lots of blessings conferred for lots of reasons. Rosary beads and other items used in prayer, called *Sacramentals*, are the items most likely to be blessed because we use them in our prayer life to “receive the chief effect of the sacraments, and various occasions in life are rendered holy.” (*Catechism of the Catholic Church 1667*). Sometimes the clergy member blessing something will say a few words of their own before giving the words of blessing, and sometimes the cleric will simply say a silent prayer over the object and make the Sign of the Cross over it. Any of these methods is a valid blessing done with the intent of the Church. These items should be treated with care. When they wear out, they should not be thrown out, but they should be burned or buried (in your backyard is fine). This respect acknowledges that the blessing has set something apart for a holy purpose – namely your growth in holiness!

October is Respect Life Month, and war takes a big toll on human life As the month continues, we continue to look at significant issues that threaten life. War has devastating effects on those involved in the fighting and those who love them. Today's wars are fought in new ways. Although the distance from the enemy has increased, the effects on the soldier have not proportionately decreased. We must continue to care for those who are involved in war and we must work and pray for peace in the world. It is not easy to achieve, but we must never lose heart. Pope Francis encouraged us, "We ask the risen Jesus, who turns death into life, to change hatred into love, vengeance into forgiveness, war into peace. Yes, Christ is our peace, and through him we implore peace for all the world." In his 1972 World Day of Peace Message, in which Pope Paul VI so famously said, "if you want peace, work for justice," he also wrote, "We believe that the idea of Peace still is, and still must be, dominant in human affairs, and that it becomes all the more urgent whenever and wherever it is contradicted by opposite ideas or deeds. It is a necessary idea, an imperative idea, an inspiring idea. It polarizes human aspirations, endeavors and hopes. Its nature is that of an aim, and as such it is at the base and at the goal of our activities, be they individual or collective."
