

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Family-Focused Mass is an essential part of our Catholic tradition. Are you looking for a way to make Sunday Mass more meaningful for your child? Beginning at this weekend's 9:00AM Mass, children in grades K-5 will be invited to participate in a special Sunday Liturgy of the Word for Children. As the congregation sits for the readings, the students will be invited forward for a special blessing and then process to the Chapel with adult volunteers who are Virtus trained and prepared to teach a child appropriate lesson, drawn from the same scriptures we will hear in the weekend Liturgy. At the Offertory, the students rejoin their families in the Worship Space.

Anna Asks....why do we ring bells? At the elevations of the host and chalice the altar servers may ring the bells. When the Mass was celebrated in Latin, the bells signaled the epiclesis (the time when the priest invokes the Holy Spirit as he holds his hands over the gifts) and consecration. Now that the Mass is celebrated in the local language, it is not a required part of the Mass, but it remains a "praiseworthy practice."

Is This Mass Intention For Your Loved One? It is always a special moment for our parish whenever family members attend a Mass whose intention is for a deceased family member or loved one. In order to add to your celebration of the Mass we invite you to please inform any member of the hospitality team of your presence so you may be offered the opportunity to bring up the gifts during the offertory. Dear Parishioners,

I want to begin with a word of thanks. I am thankful for the blessing of joining such a wonderful parish family. I have been warmly welcomed and quickly made to feel right at home. In these past two months, over fifty new families have also been made to feel at home. The Spirit is certainly active in drawing people to our parish!

While we are called to gather at Church, it doesn't end here. We gather for the purpose of being strengthened and sent forth on a mission. Each Mass ends with Deacon Bill sending us forth, "Go forth the Mass is ended..." Each week, you go out to your individual mission – to your homes, schools, workplaces, supermarkets, and sports fields – where you give witness to God's care and concern for all those you meet.

We also do that through our financial support of others on mission, as we saw in the Hope Appeal video shown in early September. The opportunity to contribute to the Annual Campaign wraps up on November 30th. Many generous parishioners have contributed and we have reached 88% of our goal in gifts and pledges (though just 84% paid – so please get those last payments in). With just under \$10,000 outstanding, I want to invite you to make a cash (or check) gift today. Our goal will be reached if each family with us this weekend gives \$30. If you have already given to the Hope Appeal, you may only be able to give \$20 more. If you have not yet given to the Appeal, you might consider giving \$40.

As we reach the end of the Hope Appeal campaign, I am confident that we can reach the goal before us.
