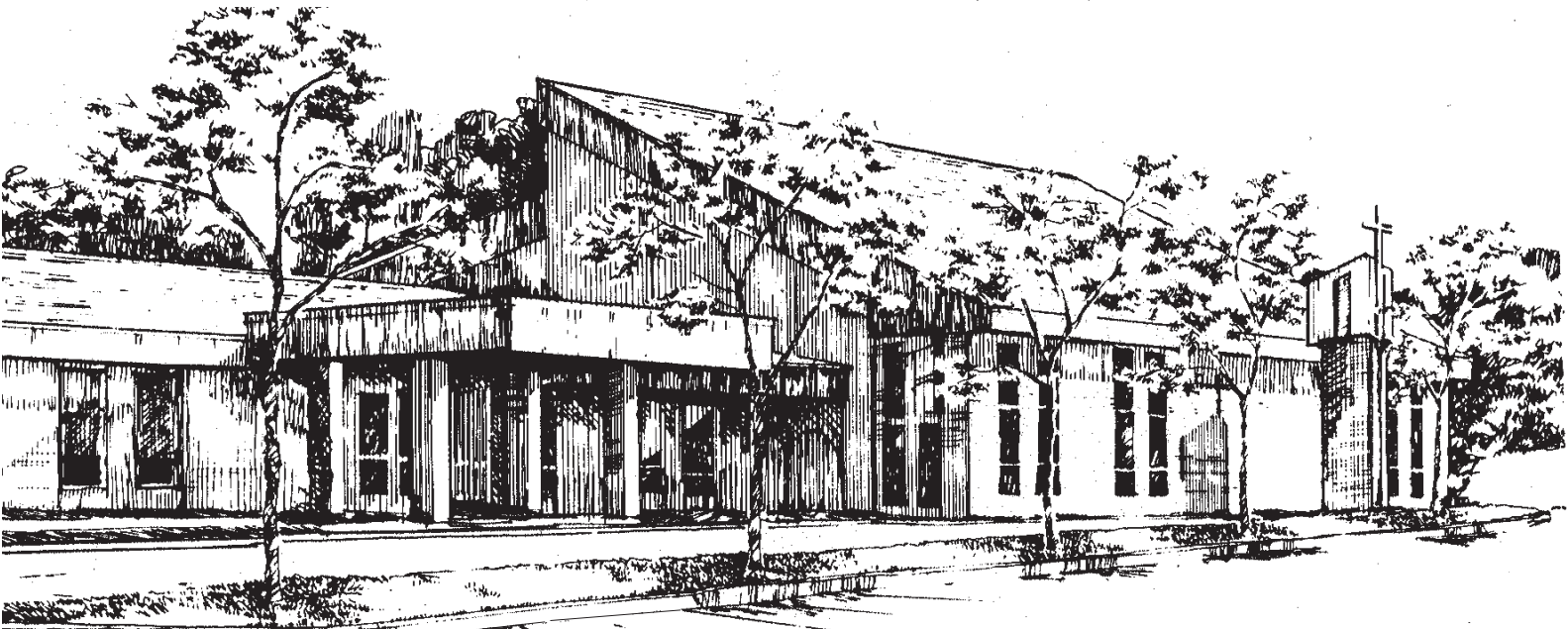

Anna Asks... Why did Jesus' closest friends have trouble recognizing him? The Gospels we are hearing during these days and weeks of Easter explain that at different times Jesus' closest friends did not recognize him after the Resurrection. Perhaps it was their unbelief or their grief, but scripture clearly reveals that there was something about his body. He could walk through the wall into the upper room and still eat baked fish. He walked and talked the entire way to Emmaus and wasn't recognized until the breaking of the bread...at which point he disappeared. His resurrected body was a transformation from the one they had known before. It was glorious, but He was veiling that glory. His resurrected body had amazing qualities, and it is a foreshadowing of the glory that awaits us at His Second Coming. We will be the same yet different when we share in the glory of our resurrected King and Lord. It is all quite beyond our comprehension or explanation, but not in a frustrating way...in a humbling and exciting kind of way – the realities of God are greater than we can imagine.
