

Anna Asks... Why would I give myself to Jesus through Mary? This week's Vacation Bible Study has a name that may be familiar to you — "Totus Tuus." It was Pope John Paul II's motto as Pope. St. Louis De Montfort said that consecrating yourself to Jesus through Mary — or Marian consecration, as it's called — "is the safest, easiest, shortest and most perfect way of approaching Jesus." To consecrate yourself to Jesus through Mary is, at its core, to say to Mary: totus tuus, "all yours, Mary." All that is mine is yours and all that is yours is mine. Consecration is to give our whole selves to Jesus through Mary, and in return, to receive him through her. When we make the Consecration to Jesus through Mary, what we are promising Our Lord and Our Blessed Mother is this: take my life and everything about it. Take my plans, my possessions, all that I love, all that I hate, all that I dream of, all that I have accomplished, all that I have failed. You are in control. I am nothing. You are everything. Do whatever You want with me. I know that in the good times and the bad, Your hand will guide, Your hand will save, Your Will be done.

The Word of God & Mother Seton... "Imitate the patience of Him we adore."—St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. What is the patience of Jesus like? We see it manifested in many ways throughout the New Testament, but in today's Gospel one way we see it is through Jesus' response to again being put to the test. Rather than just answering the question at hand, he offers a parable and guides the 'scholar' to a deeper understanding of mercy. Mercy is an essential component to living authentically the beatitudes and commandments passed on to us by our Lord. Often Jesus' patience is manifested in the way he extends mercy, and much like Moses' encouragement to heed the voice of the Lord (Dt 30:10-14), Jesus's mercy is something very near to us, already in mouths and hearts...this merciful patience is what we must imitate every day.

<u>Vocation Reflection</u> "he answered, 'The one who treated him with mercy" Serving the Church, as Pope Francis often preaches, "is a vocation of mercy anchored on Christ's mission to bring hope to the downtrodden, and comfort to those who suffer."
