

St. Pope John Paul II has said, "In Mass and in Eucharistic Adoration we meet the merciful love of God that passes through the heart of Jesus."

Saint Bruno founded the Cathusian order on the motto *Stat crux dum volvitur orbis* ("The Cross is steady while the world is turning").
