Anna Asks... What is the difference between a parish and a church? While we often use terms like church and parish interchangeably, it's important that we understand what these terms mean. The first term is "parish." The easiest thing to remember is that "parish equals people." In the Code of Canon Law, canon 515 states that: "it is a community of Christ's faithful that has been established in a stable manner...pastoral care of which has been entrusted to a parish priest [i.e., the pastor] under the authority of the diocesan bishop." Just as "parish equals people", we can say that "church equals building." The most important thing to note about the definition of church in the Code of Canon Law is that the term refers to a building, not a parish community. In fact, sometimes the church and the parish don't even have the same name. Just as there are different types of parishes (territorial, ethnic, language), there are also different types of churches (basilicas, parish churches, missions, oratories). The parish church is the principal church of a parish. A parish may also have one or two other churches in addition to the parish church. These are called secondary churches, usually given mission status.

Reminder of Training for Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors Existing ministers are invited to join new ministers for training on Monday, June 5th at 6:00pm. This will be a good chance to learn the procedures for distribution of the Precious Blood.

Another Thank You "The Board of Trustees of the Matthew 25 Farm wishes to express their sincere appreciation to the parishioners of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church for the extremely generous donation of \$1,500. In 2022 we donated to 34 separate food pantries, soup kitchens, homeless shelters, veteran and refugee groups, and others dealing with food insecurity, throughout 5 counties. Many of the food pantries picked up on a weekly basis. For the first time, Onondaga County Social Services reached out to us for produce as well, to distribute to areas that were suffering and not receiving enough resources. For the farm, agricultural production costs rose dramatically from the previous year. Fertilizer doubled in price from 2021, fuel for the tractors and farm truck rose between one-quarter to one-third, and parts, seeds, and other farm necessities all rose considerably. Your donation will help us purchase seeds, fertilizer, and many other supplies for 2023 as we continue our mission of sending fresh produce to those suffering from food insecurity throughout Central New York.
