

Anna asks... What is the Last Judgment? As the days grow shorter and the year wraps up, we find ourselves considering "last things." So, what is the Last Judgment? It's always important to keep in mind that there are two judgments. The particular judgment which every soul will experience at the hour of death, and then the "universal judgment" (or the general judgment) when all people will be judged at the end of time. Second, after Christ comes back in glory the next stage will be the resurrection of the dead. All of the dead will be raised up in order to be judged. Once that is accomplished, once the resurrection is completed then there will actually be the final judgment where Christ will make that decision about where everyone spends their eternal destiny. That's what we usually call the final judgment or "the Last Judgment." And what the final judgment is going to unveil and reveal is how those ultimate consequences have played themselves out throughout all of history. You're going to see either the fruits of everything you've done (in all its goodness) or the lack thereof (the things that you could have done). So there's a much wider network of consequences that will be revealed at the final judgment; it's more universal. (*This answer provided by Dr. Brant Pitre*)

And still there's more, St. Paul reminds us that nothing here and now can compare to what God has prepared for those who love him. How prepared are we, then, to go out and meet him when he comes again?
