Anna Asks... What are the little letters on this year's calendar. On previous year's calendars, the color font used for the date was used to indicate the color of vestment worn by the priest at Mass. This year's calendars have a letter system to indicate that. Some days have more than one saint assigned, so that leaves us with options. The saints which we celebrate are sometimes pastors, popes, missionaries, or religious sisters and brothers. Some are martyrs. The color red is used to indicate a saint who was martyred. White indicates other saints. The vestments can also indicate the liturgical season. Green is worn during Ordinary time. Purple during Advent and Lent, with the option for Rose one weekend of each. White during Easter and Christmas Season. Red is on Pentecost and Good Friday.

No 6:45am Daily Masses January 9-13 We are very blessed to have the help of retired priests (and a bishop) to cover daily Masses when Fr. O'Connor is away. Unfortunately, coverage is not available for the early Masses that week. There will be 9:00am Mass on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. There will not be Communion Services in place of Mass. Bishop Lucia and the Diocesan Office of Liturgy has asked that we do not schedule Communion Service in place of Mass, but rather find another celebration of the Eucharist nearby. Epiphany Home Blessing available this weekend Many cultures celebrate Epiphany and commemorate the visit of the Magi to the Christ Child with a special house blessing. This blessing is a wonderful way to mark the new year and bless your family home. You can do that with your family this weekend. There are blessing kits available for you to take home. If you have the holy water and chalk from last year, just grab the prayer cards, which are updated for 2023. If you want the holy water and chalk, they are available for you. The prayer card has the instructions for you to follow. You may have seen chalk writing above the door of a home. The pattern for the chalk writing is: **20+C+M+B+23** The "+" signs represent the cross and 2023 is the year. The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. Conveniently, they also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless the house."

The Word of God and Mother Seton This Holy Season of Epiphany was precisely the time that the divine light of faith which I so long resisted forced its way with an overwhelming power which made me to see and taste its infinite sweetness. -CW II, 46. The Epiphany is not only about Magi from the East bringing their gifts to the Christ-Child, but, even more so, this feast celebrates the journey each of us must make in our lives to lay down our gifts before the Lord. As it has now been revealed, we have been made coheirs to the Kingdom and copartners in the promise in Christ. This feast marks the opening of the revelation first given to Israel to all the nations. Each of us are called to rise up in splendor, gather our sons and daughters from afar, open our treasures before Him, and depart—changed—by another way and proclaiming the praises of the Lord.

In re The Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse, New York Case No. 20-30663

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT, On June 19, 2020, The Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse, New York, ("Diocese") filed for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code").

The court has established January 17, 2023 at 11:59 p.m. (prevailing Eastern time) (the "Supplemental Bar Date") as the deadline to assert claims against the Diocese arising from or relating to abuse that occurred when the survivor was 18 years of age or older, and which, prior to the enactment of the Adult Survivors Act (S.66A/A.648A) would have been subject to a statute of limitations defense ("Adult Claims").

If you have an Adult Claim against the Diocese you must file a claim on or before the Supplemental Bar Date, which will be treated confidentially in accordance with prior court orders in this Case. IF YOU DO NOT TIMELY FILE A PROOF OF CLAIM, YOU MAY FORFEIT YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE ON ANY PLAN OF REORGANIZATION AND TO SHARE IN ANY DISTRIBUTIONS TO CREDITORS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DIOCESE'S CHAPTER 11 CASE.
