

Anna Asks... **What is Ascension Thursday and do I have to go to Mass?** Also known as the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, Holy Thursday is a Holy Day of Obligation for Catholics around the world. On this day, the faithful celebrate Christ's ascension into Heaven on the 40th day after Resurrection. Depending on the year, this day falls between April 30 and June 3. In most dioceses of the United States, Ascension Thursday has been transferred to the following Sunday, so many Catholics think that the Ascension is no longer considered a holy day. Only the ecclesiastical provinces of Boston, Hartford, New York, Newark, Philadelphia, and Omaha continue to celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord on Thursday. As part of the New York province (an ecclesiastical province is basically one large archdiocese and the dioceses that are historically associated with it), we are required, under the Precepts of the Church, to attend Mass on Ascension Thursday.

Holy Day Mass – Ascension Thursday – May 26th Ascension Thursday is a Holy Day of Obligation. Holy Day Masses on Thursday are at 6:45am and 7:00pm. Please note that the office will be closed on that day.

Baptisms During Mass One of the wonderful customs of the Catholic Church, which has long been practiced at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, is the celebration of Baptisms during weekend Masses. This allows the family to experience in a concrete way what is being celebrated in the mystery of the Sacrament – the child baptized is now part of a larger community, the family of believers in the Church. For health concerns, baptisms have been celebrated in smaller gatherings. We will begin again to offer the option to families to have their children baptized at the 5:00pm Mass on the First Saturday of the month, or the 9:00am Mass on the Second Sunday of the month, or the 11:00am Mass on the Third Sunday of the month. Please contact the Parish Office if you would like to schedule a baptism.

Saint Bede the Venerable Bede is one of the few saints honored as such even during his lifetime (672-735). His writings were filled with such faith and learning that even while he was still alive, a Church council ordered them to be read publicly in the churches. At an early age, Bede was entrusted to the care of the abbot of the Monastery of St. Paul, Jarrow. The happy combination of genius and the instruction of scholarly, saintly monks, produced a saint and an extraordinary scholar, perhaps the most outstanding one of his day. He was deeply versed in all the sciences of his times: natural philosophy, the philosophical principles of Aristotle, astronomy, arithmetic, grammar, ecclesiastical history, the lives of the saints and especially, holy Scripture. From the time of his ordination to the priesthood at 30—he had been ordained a deacon at 19—till his death, Bede was ever occupied with learning, writing, and teaching. Besides the many books that he copied, he composed 45 of his own, including 30 commentaries on books of the Bible. His *Ecclesiastical History of the English People* is commonly regarded as of decisive importance in the art and science of writing history. A unique era was coming to an end at the time of Bede's death: It had fulfilled its purpose of preparing Western Christianity to assimilate the non-Roman barbarian North. Bede recognized the opening to a new day in the life of the Church even as it was happening. Although eagerly sought by kings and other notables, even Pope Sergius, Bede managed to remain in his own monastery until his death. Only once did he leave for a few months in order to teach in the school of the archbishop of York. Bede died in 735 praying his favorite prayer: "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As in the beginning, so now, and forever."

Rosary Novena for Vocations - There is no one to be ordained to the priesthood in the Syracuse Diocese this year. In response, the diocesan family is invited to pray for an outpouring of priestly vocations. Bishop Lucia is inviting all to join him for a Holy Hour for Vocations at the Cathedral on Saturday, June 4th at 10:00am. In the days prior to this event, the CNY Marian Center is organizing a Vocation novena. SEAS is privileged to be hosting 24-hour Adoration May 31-June 1. We will begin following the 6:45am Mass on May 31st and close before the 9:00am Mass on June 1st. "Jesus has made Himself the Bread of Life to give us life. Night and day, He is there. If you really want to grow in love, come back to the Eucharist, come back to that Adoration" (Mother Teresa). Help us be there night and day for Jesus by offering your time and praying before His true presence. We are asking for two adorers to pray with the exposition of the Holy Eucharist and one parishioner to lead us in a Rosary each of the 24-hour slots. The sign-up sheet for this event will be placed in the gathering area.
