

Anna Asks: Who can be a Catholic Godparent? As we are seeing Baptisms return to weekend Mass, it has us thinking about who can stand up as Godparent. Church law requires that a candidate for baptism into the Church's community must have at least one sponsor. This sponsor must be a fully initiated Catholic (Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation), at least 16 years of age and faithfully practicing the Catholic faith. If two Sponsors are selected, one must be male and one must be female. The maximum number of sponsors is two. A baptized non-Catholic may not be a sponsor but may act as a Christian Witness. Non-baptized persons may not act as a Sponsor or a witness to a baptism of a child in the Catholic faith, nor can a baptized Catholic who is not Confirmed. A godparent's responsibilities extend far beyond standing with the family at church. A godparent is expected to be a spiritual guide for the child for a life-long journey in relationship with Jesus Christ and the Catholic Church.

Saints Isaac Jogues, Jean de Brébeuf, and Companions (October 19 Feast Day) These Jesuits are the first martyrs of the North American continent officially recognized by the Church. He gave up that career to work among the Huron Indians in the New World, and in 1636, he and his companions, under the leadership of Jean de Brébeuf, arrived in Quebec. The Hurons were constantly warred upon by the Iroquois, and in a few years Father Jogues was captured by the Iroquois and imprisoned for 13 months. An unexpected chance for escape came to Isaac Jogues through the Dutch, and he returned to France, bearing the marks of his sufferings. Welcomed home as a hero, Father Jogues might have sat back, thanked God for his safe return, and died peacefully in his homeland. But his zeal led him back once more to the fulfillment of his dreams. In a few months he sailed for his missions among the Hurons. In 1646, he and Jean de Lalande, who had offered his services to the missionaries, set out for Iroquois country in the belief that a recently signed peace treaty would be observed. They were captured by a Mohawk war party, and on October 18, Father Jogues was put to death. Jean de Lalande was killed the next day at Ossernenon - today called Auriesville, just down the thruway. Other martyrs include René Goupil who with Lalande, had offered his services as an oblate. Father Anthony Daniel, Jean de Brébeuf, Gabriel Lalemant, Father Charles Garnier, and Father Noel Chabanel. These eight Jesuit martyrs of North America were canonized in 1930. The Church in North America sprang from the blood of martyrs, as has been true in so many places. The ministry and sacrifices of these saints challenges each of us, causing us to ask just how deep is our faith and how strong our desire to serve even in the face of death.
