Anna Asks... Is it appropriate to display the American Flag in Church? Surprisingly to many, there are no regulations of any kind governing the display of flags in Roman Catholic Churches. Neither the Code of Canon law, nor the liturgical books of the Roman rite comment on this practice. As a result, the question of whether and how to display the American flag in a Catholic Church is left up to the judgment of the diocesan bishop, who in turn often delegates this to the discretion of the pastor. The origin of the display of the American flag in many parishes in the United States appears have its origins in the offering of prayers for those who served during the Second World War. At that time, many bishops and pastors provided a book of remembrance near the American flag, requesting prayers for loved ones – especially those serving their country in the armed forces – as a way of keeping before the attention of the faithful the needs of military families. On this Memorial Day and always, we continue to keep in our prayers those who have given their lives for our country.

"Totus Tuus" means "Totally Yours" – it was the motto of Pope John Paul II and serves as the goal of the program – to dedicate ourselves, like Mary, completely to the Lord. The methodology, structure, content, and enthusiasm of Totus Tuus is not only concerned with teaching the faith, but also igniting the hearts of the team members and young people.
