**Anna Asks... Bishop's retirement age?** Bishops in the Catholic Church are required to submit a letter of resignation on their 75<sup>th</sup> birthday. On June 18<sup>th</sup>, Bishop Cunningham will turn 75 and do just that. The Vatican will take their time considering the needs of the Diocese of Syracuse and who will best lead our Diocesan family. There is no set timetable for this process, but recently the process has been taking 10-14 months. I am sure that there will be a great deal of media attention around the naming of our next bishop, so just keep an eye out for the "white smoke." In the meantime, we offer prayers of gratitude for the gentle leadership of Bishop Cunningham and ask the Holy Spirit to anoint the next bishop with all the gifts needed to guide our diocese as a good shepherd.
